

How to Earn Your SSC

Step 1: Review the Site Supervisor Scheme Handbook

The Site Supervisor Scheme Handbook outlines the certificate process, prerequisites, and required skills.

It is recommended that all applicants read the handbook thoroughly before applying

Step 2: Submit Your Application

- Access the application through the BPI Certificate Portal
- Document your prerequisites (knowledge and experience) as detailed in the handbook
- If additional experience is needed, consult your employer or a BPI Test Center for training opportunities.

Step 3: Pay for the Exam & Optional Training Module


- SSC Exam Fee: \$200 if paid by ACH/Check/Debit or \$206 if paid by Credit
- Optional Training Module: \$150 if paid by ACH/Check/Debit or \$154.50 if paid by Credit (not required but recommended)

Step 4: Take the Exam

- Once your application is approved, you can schedule your exam
- > The exam tests your knowledge of site supervision, leadership, and worksite safety.

Step 5: Check Your Score & Receive Your Certificate

- > After completing the exam, your score will be available immediately on-screen
- Scores and certificates can also be accessed in the BPI Certificate Portal.

1	What are the prerequisites for the SSC?	Candidates must document experience and baseline knowledge as outlined in the Site Supervisor Scheme Handbook. If additional experience is required, work with your employer or a BPI Test Center.
2	Is training required before taking the exam?	No, but an optional Training Module is available for \$150.
3	How do I apply for the SSC?	Applications are submitted via the <u>BPI Certificate</u> <u>Portal.</u>
4	What is the cost of the SSC exam?	The exam fee is \$200. Optional training module: \$150 (not required but recommended).
5	When will I receive my exam results?	Scores are available immediately after the exam. Certificates can be accessed through the BPI Certificate Portal.
6	How do I earn BPI CEUs?	 BPI Certified Professionals can earn 6 CEU credits by: Passing the SSC Exam Uploading their SSC Certificate to BPI's CEU Account
