



## **Job Description**

The Energy Audit Quality Assurance Inspector is primarily responsible for conducting QA inspections on walk-through energy efficiency assessments in single-family and multi-family homes. This position may also conduct the energy assessments as needed, and the installation of energy efficiency equipment and products such as light bulbs, shower heads, and weatherstripping in single and multi-family homes as needed. Evaluate the energy efficiency of utility customer homes including heating and air conditioning, insulation, weatherization, and electrical loads such as lighting, water heating, etc. You must have experience in one or more of these areas or in energy auditing and have excellent customer service skills.

Coaching energy auditors and engaging the customer in their home is the most important piece of this job. Of equal importance: you care about making homes more efficient, you understand building elements (construction, materials, HVAC, insulation, etc), you can make basic improvements using hand tools, and you are capable of making recommendations for additional improvements. Must be physically capable of working 10-hour days at a fast pace by yourself or with a team. You must be able to engage tenants, homeowners, management, and co-workers in a professional and respectful manner.

Some ladder work is required. Must conform to all safety and PPE requirements. Pre-employment background check and drug screening is required. Clean driving and criminal record required. BPI Building Analyst Certification is required before starting work, but training and certification can be negotiated as a term of employment. You must have a smart phone for the mileage and time-keeping apps. This is a high-production position that requires driving 100+ miles per day 4 days per week, 10-12 hours per day, depending on demand.
